Background / About Us:

The Phillip Island Land Alliance (PILA) represents a gathering of groups who advocate to protect and restore the native biodiversity of Phillip Island (Millowl). We acknowledge the First Peoples as Traditional Custodians of this land and recognise their continued care of this unique environment.

We communicate with a unified voice and common objectives, to provide opportunities for networking, and a platform for a coordinated approach to funding applications and islandwide environmental care.

We come together to educate, connect and engage our community with the natural environment for the health and wellbeing of all, now and into the future.

Vision:

A connected community who respects and protects the unique and biodiverse environment of Phillip Island (Millowl).

Mission:

To provide a collaborative voice for carers of the land through advocacy, education and networking to protect and regenerate Phillip Island's natural environment.

Principles and Values:

We will embrace the following principles and values while working together in the Alliance:

- Stewardship working together to rewild and regenerate the island environment and its biodiversity, sharing our combined knowledge and learnings for a positive future
- Respect promoting listening, inclusion, diversity and tolerance in the Alliance and in engaging the broader community; respecting our natural environment
- Equality preserving equal voice between groups and preserving the identity and independence of each group
- Integrity clear and factual communication between groups and the broader community to ensure the Alliance integrity, longevity and succession of groups
- Collaboration working collaboratively to our common goals and sharing our combined biodiversity knowledge and education
- Knowledge using combined knowledge, research and evidence bases to support actions and facilitate regional education; connect with and embrace the learnings of the First Peoples, the Bunurong/Boonwurrung, to pay respect and create opportunities for education and conservation
- Empowerment connecting people to land through education and enjoyment, to promote wellbeing, take action on climate change, and foster ongoing respect and active custodianship of the land
